ARTICLES

Article 2. Bond for New Village water, sewer and drainage improvements and for improvements to sewer manholes, acquisition of a step screen and water meters.

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,782,500 (gross budget) for the purpose of construction improvements to the New Village water, sewer and drainage systems, in addition to, improvements to the sewer manholes within the sewer district to eliminate infiltration and inflow of groundwater, acquisition of a step screen for the Creighton Street lift station, and water meters under the Federal Stimulus Package Program and will qualify the Town for federal funds in the form of 50% principal forgiveness, such sums to be raised by the issuance of Serial Bonds or Notes not to exceed \$2,782,500 under, and in compliance, with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act (NH RSA 33:1 et seq., as amended) and to authorize the Town Council to issue and negotiate such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such other actions as may be necessary to effect the issuance, negotiation, sale and delivery of such bonds or notes as shall be in the best interest of the Town of Newmarket, NH, additionally to participate in the State Revolving Fund (SRF) RSA 486:14 established for this purpose, and to allow the Town Council to expend such monies as become available from the Federal and State Governments and pass any vote relating thereto. Subject to the receipt of Federal Stimulus Funding. (3/5 ballot vote required) Recommended by the Town Council and recommended by the Budget Committee

Article 3. Operating Budget

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, as a gross operating budget, not including appropriations by special warrant articles and other appropriations voted separately, the amounts set forth on the budget posted with the warrant or as amended by vote of the first session, for the purposes set forth therein, totaling \$10,177,760. Should this article be defeated, the operating budget shall be \$10,546,520, which is the same as last year, with certain adjustments required by previous action of the Town of Newmarket, or by law, or the Town Council may hold one (1) special meeting, in accordance with RSA 40:13, X and XVI, to take up the issue of a revised operating budget only. (Majority vote required) Recommended by the Budget Committee
